








PLEASE NOTE: The numbers in the walk description match the numbers on the map

- 1 Cross the footbridge.
- 2 Turn left to the side road, **not** the dual carriageway.
- 3 Turn right on the road, pass a path on the left.
- 4 Turn left on the track. Ignore the private signs.
- 5 Keep straight on.
- 6 Follow the track past stables, ponds and houses.






- 8 Turn left between two fences along the edge of the golf course.
- 9 Keep on the path between the fences.
- 10 Just before the car park turn left off the path to meet the road.
- 11 Cross the road to the steps and the bridge to return to Tyland Barn.



Walk B Chalk Downland & Ancient Woodland, (2.1miles / 3.4km, some hills)

- 1 Cross the footbridge.
- 2 Turn left to the side road, **not** the dual carriageway.
- 3 Turn right on the road; pass a path on the left.
- 4 Turn left on the track. Ignore the private signs.
- 5 Turn right onto a track.
- 6 Go through the gate and follow the road.
- 7 Take the first path on the left over a stile.
- 8 Bear right into the wood.

- 9 Go straight on through four gates to meet the track.
- 10 Turn right and pass the buildings.
- 11 Turn left off the track at the 10mph sign. Ignore the opening before this.
- 12 Turn left between two fences along the edge of the golf course.
- 13 Keep on the path between the fences.
- 14 Just before the car park turn left off the path to meet the road.
- 15 Cross the road to the steps and the bridge to return to Tyland Barn.




























Blue Bell Hill, Burham Down, Frith Wood, Kit's Coty (7miles / 11.3km, very hilly)



- 1 Cross the footbridge, turn left down the steps, turn right on the road, pass a path on the left, turn left on the track (ignore the private signs). Follow the track through the gate for Great Cossington Farm.
- 2 a) Just before the houses, turn right through a kissing gate onto a faint track.
- b) At the end of the hedge on the right, turn right diagonally across the field to the stile to the right of the houses. Cross the stile and go between two fences to the road.
- At the road turn left and almost immediately right up steps and beside a garage. Cross the field heading for the house and cross a stile to the road. This is a busy road – Take Care!
- 4 Cross the road, follow the hedge through two kissing gates and over a footbridge. Follow the field boundary to a gate, cross a track, go through a kissing gate. Follow the side of a pond then follow the field boundary uphill to a kissing gate.
- 5 Turn left on a wide track between a hedge and vines. At the top of the hill turn right keeping the hedge on your left. At the corner of the field bear left through a hedge then follow the path across the field to an alley between houses and the road.
- 6 Turn right on the road then left at the main road beside the Red Bull Pub. Take the first right (Eccles Row) towards the school. At the end of the road carry straight on along the path until the reservoir taking the right fork, **not** through the blue gate.
- Turn right through a green barrier towards the houses. Turn left on the path opposite the pylon on your right (this is a well used path but isn't a right of way). At the road turn right towards the church.
- At the church (worth a visit) carry straight on the road. Just before the barrier, turn left on a path and follow this (beside a wall) on top of a bank and beside the river. Turn left off the bank back to the church.
- At the church, turn right on the road (Medway Valley
- 1 Cross the footbridge, turn left down the steps, turn right on the road, pass a path on the left, turn left on the track(ignore the private signs).
- 2 a) Pass the stables, where the track bends left, just before the ponds, turn right onto a track. b) Keep straight on through the gate then two kissing gates.
- c) Turn right through another kissing gate and into a small wood. Turn left, keeping the wood on your left, to the road.
- At the road turn left, take the next path on the left (North Downs Way).
- 4 Straight on at the path junction.
- At the road junction *Take Care* straight over and take the path uphill (North Downs Way to Kit's Coty). Pass Kit's Coty on the left. Climb the steps to the road, turn left along the pavement to the footbridge, cross the bridge.
- 6 At the road take the path on the right just past the bus stop. Climb up through the woods to the road.
- Straight over through the wood. At the fork in the path after 50m bear left. Bear left again when you meet a path coming in from the right. Bear left again to a T-junction in the paths.
- Turn right following the edge of the wood.
- At the path junction just before the motorway turn left (waymarked) to meet the road at Podkin Meadow.
- 10 Turn right on the road, straight on at the junction to cross the bridge. Turn left into the Bluebell Hill picnic site, then turn right to follow the path along the top of the ridge. Go through a kissing gate, straight on where the North Downs Way goes off to the right.
- 11 Go through the next gate on the right, then left on a sunken track between two fences going downhill and passing another gate and notice board on the left.

Walk). At the junction with footpaths turn right onto the footpath across the field. Go through a green barrier then turn right on a track and then left. Stay on the concrete road passing the disused works on your right.

- 10 At the start of the hill bear left off the road into a field and follow the right hand boundary to the top of the hill. Pass a path on the right, go under the power lines and fork right following the path along the edge of the field. At the far end turn right to meet a track. Turn left.
- 11 Almost immediately turn left on a path through woods, passing a small pond and a pylon on the right. 50m after the pylon, at the end of the wood, take the left fork along the edge of the wood. **Do not** go straight on to meet the wide track. The path bears right and meets the road at a house.
- 12 Go straight on, heading for the pylon. At the pylon bear right, towards the trees. Turn left along the trees or use the parallel path through the trees. Pass another path on the right.
- 13 At the end of the wood turn right following the field boundary with vines on your left. At the top of the hill, pass your outward route on the left, continue down the hill to the kissing gate on the right.
- 14 Go through the gate, follow the boundary, past the moat, through another kissing gate, cross the track, through a gate. Follow the boundary to a footbridge and through two more gates to the road, which is very busy.
- 15 Cross the road, cross the field, go past a garage and down the steps to the road. Turn left and immediately right into a narrow field to a stile. Bear right across the field to meet a faint track, turn left to meet a good track.
- 16 Turn right on the track, pass the houses then turn left on to a path opposite the back of the 10mph sign, ignore the opening before this. Turn left to follow the path between two fences along the edge of the golf course. Just before the car park turn left to meet the road, cross the road to the steps and cross the bridge back to Tyland Barn.
- 12 At the path junction, turn sharp left going downhill past the chalk pits on the left.
- 13 Turn left (waymarked) between two hedges to meet a track, turn right to the road.
- 14 At the road turn left to the junction, straight over to Bull Lane, cross a stile onto a path. **Do not** use the paved path. Cross two more stiles, head for the pylon, cross two stiles close together, keep going in the same direction keeping the houses on the right. Cross another stile and head for the houses.
- 15 At the seat, cut back on yourself to the left, cross the field, through a hedge into a field of vines. Keep the hedge on your right and the vines on your left. At the end of the hedge turn left on a track, straight on down the hill, then turn right through a kissing gate.
- 16 Go through the gate, straight ahead following the boundary, past the moat, through another kissing gate, cross the track, through a gate. Follow the boundary to a footbridge and through two more gates to the road which is very busy.
- 17 Cross the road, cross the field, go past a garage and down the steps to the road. Turn left and immediately right into a narrow field to a stile. Bear right across the field to meet a faint track, turn left to meet a good track.
- 18 Turn right on the track, pass the oast house then turn left on to a path at the 10mph sign, ignore the opening before this. Cross the stream then turn left to follow the path between two fences along the edge of the golf course. Just before the car park turn left to meet the road, cross the road to the steps and cross the bridge back to Tyland Barn.
